MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

The second year of the pandemic was a challenging time for Aurora Public Library as we continued to adjust services as COVID precautions and the Town Square construction project permitted.

When Ontario went into a province-wide lockdown on December 26, 2020, libraries were still able to offer curbside pickup. Due to the Town's construction project, the Library could not resume pickup of holds until January 20, 2021 when a new temporary window for holds pickup was installed at the south end of the building on Church Street. For the convenience of our customers, a new return slot was installed at the same location.

Although it wasn't until July 2021 that we welcomed customers back with in-library computer use, study tables and browsing collections, we continued to adapt as the landscape evolved. Convenient and accessible virtual programming was well-received and will be continued as we resume in-library programming.

APL recognized the impact the pandemic was having on our community and after assessing a pilot project of suspending late fees, they were eliminated effective June 2021 to reduce barriers so that every member of our community can use the Library with dignity and without fear of overdue fines.

Throughout a year when life was dramatically altered, APL adapted services with resourceful and innovative approaches to the realities presented by the pandemic and the construction project. The Board and staff thank you for your ongoing support and look forward to providing new opportunities that will engage, enrich and empower our community.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS

- A multicultural and newcomer survey and report on APL services, collections and programming was completed.
- Expanded volunteer opportunities for youth included virtual school help for elementary students.
- Black History Month featured a conversation with academic, author and public speaker, Dr. Cheryl Thompson.
- Earth Day was celebrated with a presentation on building for sustainability with Chris Ballard, Passive House Canada.
- Entrepreneurs-in-Residence featured four local entrepreneurs on keeping afloat in the time of COVID.
- APL partnered with The Aurora Sports Hall of Fame and created a series of video interviews for their comic book, Heroes of the Hall.

- Literary highlights included author visits with Plum Johnson, Farzana Doctor, Drew Hayden Taylor and Anna Yin.
- APL's first Editor-in-Residence supported emerging and published authors through workshops and manuscript evaluations.
- A screening and discussion on the documentary Call Me Human was held in partnership with the Aurora Film Circuit.
- Civic engagement was encouraged through a virtual Meet the Candidates event with candidates seeking seats in the federal election.
- A new APL-branded return bin was installed at the Go Station.
- Reading challenges for all ages were expanded through Beanstack and included prizes from local businesses.
